

For winter access: Head on 8 towards Troy, in Troy take a left on Randall Flat Road and go for about 2.5 miles. Take a right on Tamarack Road and park at the end where the plow has stopped. Head up the road do not stray from this road. There will be a significant logging operation on your right or to the North. At the end of the logging operation the road will flatten out, and you will come to a fork go right. At this point you have traveled about 1.5 to 2 miles. You know you are on the right track if about 100 yards after the fork you come across a large cedar on the right side of the road, in blue paint it says out of stand. Give this tree a hug. About a quarter mile after this tree the canopy will open up, you have reached the summer parking area. You know you are in the summer parking area if there is a road/driveway that climbs to your left, or south, and has a sign that says no motorized traffic xc skiers welcome. This is a driveway, please respect the landowner. To your right is the summer parking area. The trail heads north out of the parking area on a subtle ridge. After just a few hundred yards it will contour around to your right or the east and then southeast. You will then switch back to your left or the North and travel just above a drainage. Stay at about this heading for no more than a half mile and you should come upon the picnic area in the giant cedar grove. The drainage that you are contouring above flows right through the picnic area, it is best to stay on the trail above the drainage. Enjoy your visit.

Summer access: Take a right off of Mountain View Road on Moscow Mtn Road. After you have gone by the big brown information sign and climbed up the switch backs you will come to a fork in about a mile stay left and keep climbing. At your next fork at the "four corners" parking area you will stay right. After you level out and perhaps even feel like you are descending slightly you will go for about a mile or so. You will be looking for an open flat parking area on your left, and on the right a road/driveway will climb steeply to the south. At the beginning of the driveway to the right you may be able to see a sign that says no motorized traffic, park in the area on your left. The trail to the cedar grove heads north out of the parking area. Enjoy your visit please stay on the trail and respect the mountain.
